Ian Ling Stuckey completed his primary education in Kavieng and Port Moresby before attending St. Peters Lutheran College in Brisbane, Australia. He completed grade 12 in 1977, then attended Griffith University in Brisbane from where he graduated in 1981 with a Bachelor of Science (BSc) with a double major in Applied Mathematics and Land Use Planning.

Prior to entering politics Mr Ling-Stuckey was Chairman of Monian Group of companies, which has diversified interests in property, development, plantations and gaming. His family business interests were founded in Kavieng, New Ireland Province in 1937. He established the Ling-Stuckey Foundation which funds water tanks and small-scale micro-economic projects for village communities.

Mr Ling-Stuckey served as a member for Kavieng in his first term from 1997 to 2002 and had been a Minister for Mining, Public Service and Commerce & Industry. He is the first Member for Kavieng since democratic government was

introduced in 1964, to be returned to the National Parliament three times. He serves his second term as the Member for New Ireland Provincial and as Governor of the province. And was re-elected as Member for Kavieng in 2017.

He has been a member of the PNG Land Board; the Industries Assistance Board; Deputy Chairman of the PNG Town Planning Board and from 1991 to 1995 was a commissioner of the National Capital District Commission.

Mr Ling-Stuckey has represented Papua New Guinea on several occasions as a member of the PNG squash team, having won three gold medals and a bronze medal at the 1983 South Pacific Games in Western Samoa and the 1987 South Pacific Games in New Caledonia.

He was awarded a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George (CMG) for his services to community, business and politics in the Queens Birthday Honours for 1999.

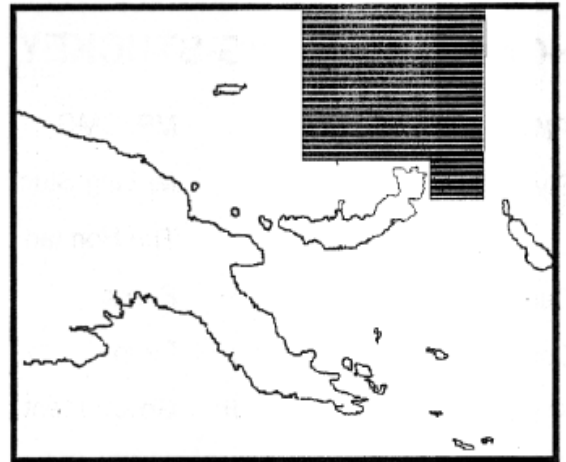
